YOUTH PROGRAM BASICS

- Annual 1 day field trip open to all students in District School Board Vision Program
- We work collaboratively with 1 primary Vision Teacher Liaison to organize program
- Representatives from our 3 partner groups collaborate with us and participate in the program when possible

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- 8 20 students (programs average 14)
- Ages JK Grade 12, ages 4 19
- Students receive a Courage Canada jersey
- We provide / organize skates, helmets, elbow pads, kneepads, gloves, sticks, adapted pucks
- We help organize 1 on 1 skating mentors (high school hockey team, University club, local Junior Club, private hockey school)

PROGRAM GOALS

- Ensure as many Canadian youth who are blind or partially sighted have the opportunity to get on the ice!
- Inspire the students with Mark DeMontis's story
- Explain the sport of hockey / introduce the sport of blind hockey
- Engage community partners
- Provide a memorable learning experience for your students!
